## ERNA – European Red Cross / Red Crescent Network on HIV, AIDS and TB Plan of Action 2007

## Context

Tuberculosis (TB) and HIV, AIDS represent serious health and social problems within the European region. According to the latest official statistics, 2.2 million people were living with HIV in Europe in 2005, most of them (1.6 million) in eastern Europe and central Asia.

Basic facts about HIV in Europe

• HIV incidence is increasing steadily in western and central Europe and dramatically in Eastern Europe. This will remain a major challenge to public health in the 21st century.

- There are people living with HIV in every European country. An estimated 270,000 people were newly infected with HIV in 2006 in the region.
- Almost one-third of the newly diagnosed HIV infections in the region are in people aged 15 –24 years.
- As of mid-2006, only about 13 per cent of those in need were receiving anti-retroviral treatment.
- In eastern Europe overall, using non-sterile injecting drug equipment remains the predominant mode of HIV transmission.

• In central and western Europe, the predominant transmission group is heterosexual. About three-quarters of heterosexually acquired HIV infections in these areas are among immigrants and migrants.

• People who use non-sterile drug equipment represent more than two-thirds of HIV cases in the region. These individuals remain especially poorly served when it comes to anti-retroviral therapy.

• Across the continent, HIV infections through heterosexual contact are increasing steadily and women account for a rising proportion of cases.

Basic facts about TB in Europe and worldwide

- Tuberculosis is the single most deadly microbe in history, having killed an estimated 1 billion people since the dawn of recorded civilization.
- More people are dying of TB today than ever before, about 1.7 million each year. It is the world's leading cause of maternal mortality and the leading killer of people with HIV, AIDS.
- One in three people on earth are now infected with TB bacilli and 10 per cent of them will develop the active disease sometime in their life.
- If left untreated, a person with infectious TB will on average infect 12–15 other people in the course of one year.
- TB is fully curable in more than 90 per cent of patients with a six to eight month course of first-line drugs that cost as little as US\$ 20 on the global market.
- In the European region, 450,000 people develop TB every year and 70,000 people die of it.

• TB overwhelmingly affects the most vulnerable people in European societies – the very poor, the homeless, the elderly, alcoholics, drug users, prisoners – and the uncontrolled rise in HIV prevalence in Eastern Europe will worsen the TB epidemic, as it has in Africa.

• In many countries of the former Soviet Union, TB control is plagued by poor treatment practices – mainly the use of inappropriate or poor quality drugs and high percentages of patients who fail to complete their treatment.

• Poor treatment practices have produced dangerously high levels of multi drug-resistant TB (MDR-TB) – strains that are resistant to the two most potent firstline TB drugs, rifampicin and isoniazid, and are up to 100 times more costly to treat with much lower cure rates.

• All 12 of the countries in the world today with the highest levels of MDR-TB are in the European region. Poor treatment of MDR-TB is now generating "extensively drug-resistant" strains that do not respond to most second-line TB drugs and are virtually untreatable.

## **ERNA** background

ERNA was established in 1998 in Rome with the aim of coordinating the sharing of experiences, transfer of best practices and the promotion of collaborative efforts among National Societies of the European region. The network's vision is to have well functioning National Societies that are able to address HIV, AIDS, TB and related problems. Currently ERNA gathers 40 Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies from Europe.

The mission of the network is to encourage participation and to help strengthen National Societies' operational capacity to combat HIV, AIDS, TB and other communicable diseases by gradually developing activities at the community level particularly in the areas of prevention, care, treatment, control, harm reduction, psychosocial support, legal support, reduction of stigma and discrimination, social integration and other community activities targeted at the most vulnerable people.

General objective of ERNA is to contribute to the reduction of the spread of HIV, AIDS, TB and other communicable diseases principally among the most vulnerable people.

This year ERNA is having an important task to participate in the preparations of the European Red Cross/Red Crescent conference which will take place in May 2007. In order to spread the information about the network, the updated brochure and CD with informational materials will be distributed during the Conference in Istanbul.

ERNA is taking a lead role in promoting the links between National Societies and networks and other organisations. It is a coordinating body searching for better communication between National Societies as well as between National Societies and the Federation. ERNA has an important role in strengthening advocacy activities. Co-operation between National Societies and governments, WHO, UN agencies, other non-governmental organizations and their mutual exchange of experiences might have a positive synergetic effect on all beneficiaries as well as it can possibly strengthen the national Health Care systems.

ERNA stresses the importance of reinforcing the involvement of people living with HIV (PLWH) as well as people affected by HIV, AIDS and TB and other target groups in this co-operation. ERNA considers initiating the partnership with East European & Central Asian Union of PLWH Organisations (ECUO).

ERNA searches for the opportunities to build capacity of the National Societies both in HIV and TB field.

The Network wants to develop a concept of ERNA sub-regional coaches. In pilot stage, two persons will be selected through consultation from among ERNA member National Societies to be trained in HIV and TB field and become ERNA resource persons, who will have input and contribute to capacity building, experience exchange and information sharing among the ERNA members.

ERNA considers organising training on AIDS Competence for interested National Societies in order to understand the process and use it while reflecting on their work.

ERNA supports the scale-up of the Harm Reduction activities in the region. This year the network wants to follow up the trainings in Villa Maraini and find out about further development and challenges of the National Societies carrying out the Harm Reduction activities.

ERNA is also interested in being an active part of New HIV and AIDS Global Alliance within the Federation and strongly supports Global Alliance main objectives:

- preventing further infections
- expanding care, treatment and services
- reduce stigma and discrimination
- strengthening community
