

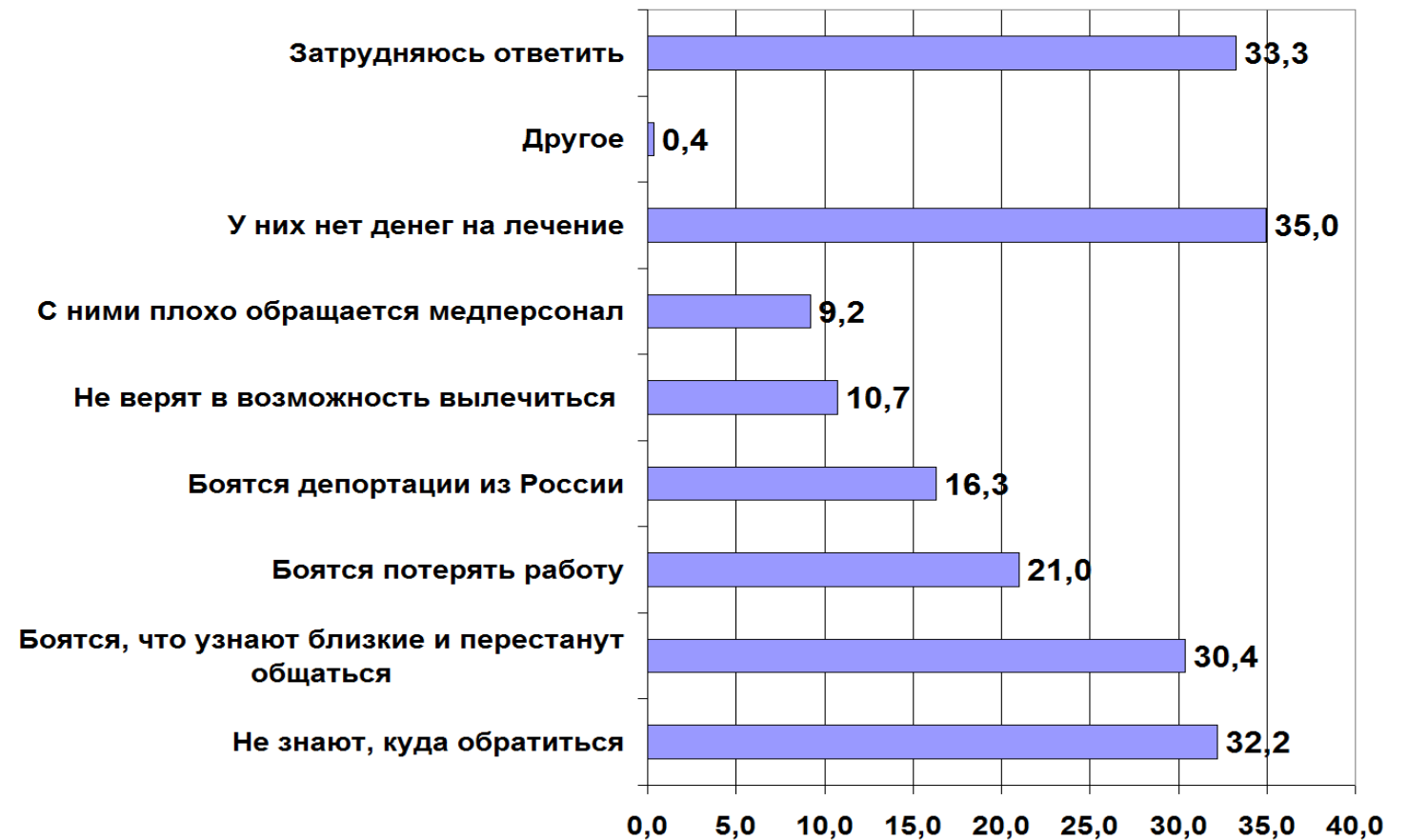
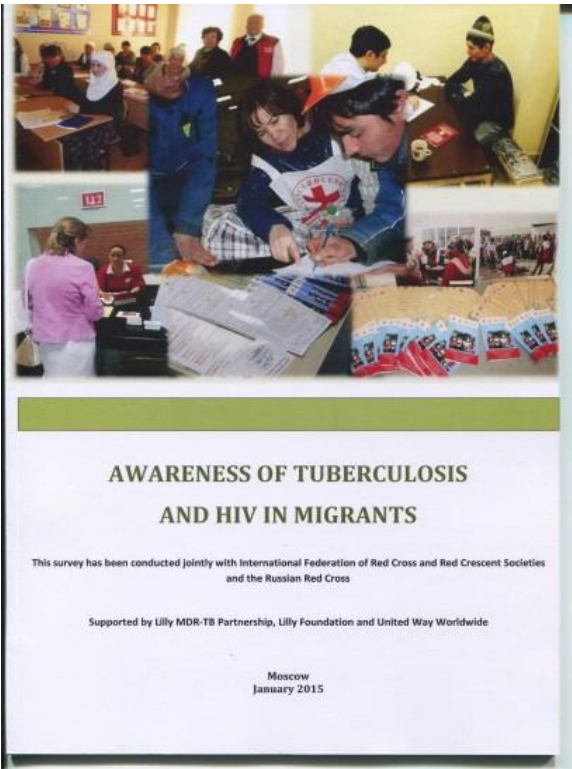
Complex support to displaced people with HIV from Ukraine in Russia

Main challenges for people with uncertain legal status in Russia:

- Lack of information on their rights
- Lack of access to health services
- Fear of stigma and discrimination when contacting healthcare facilities
- Low income that doesn't allow meeting basic food and health care needs
- Difficulties in obtaining legal status

Survey to identify priorities related HIV, TB in migrant communities

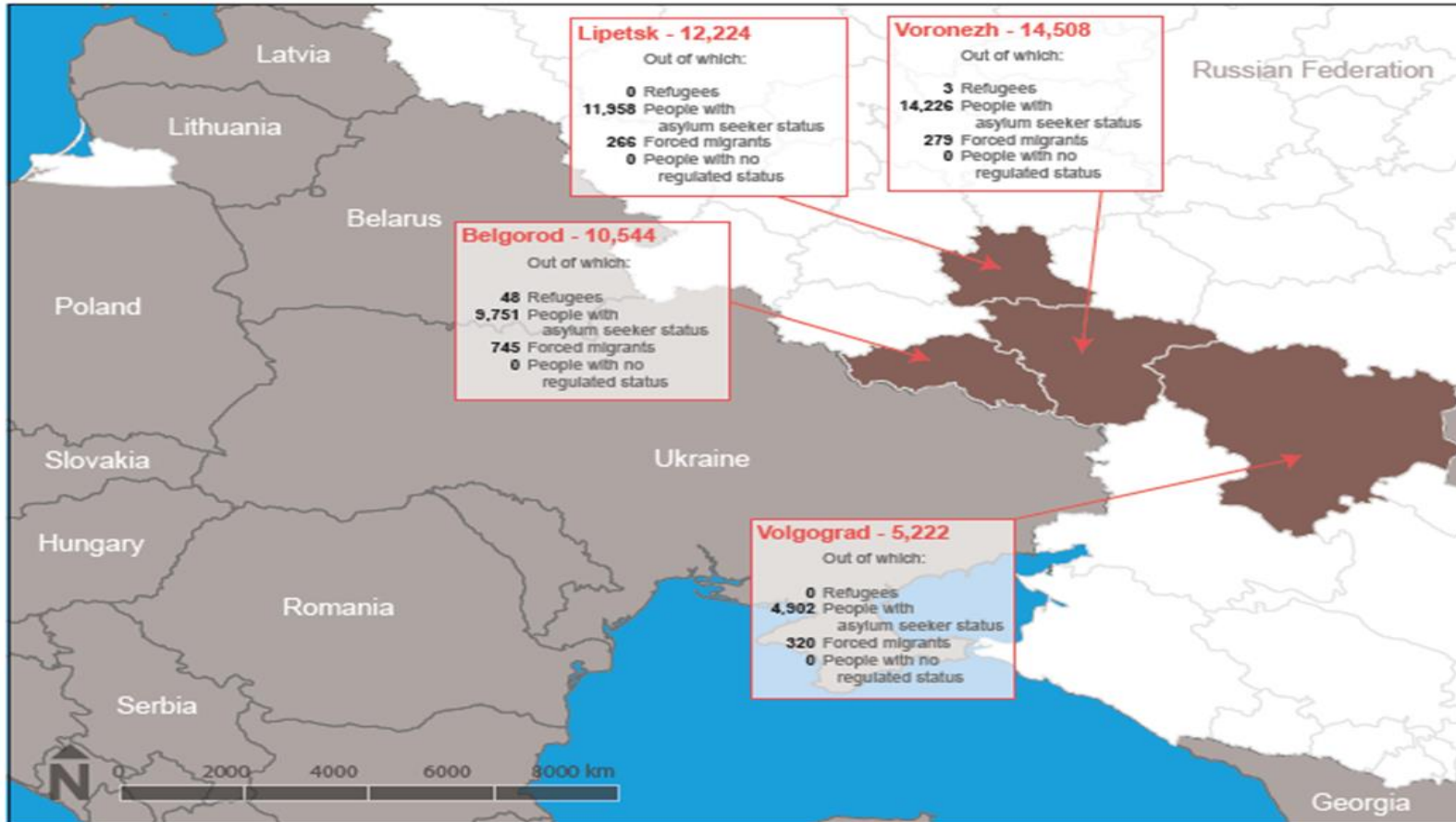

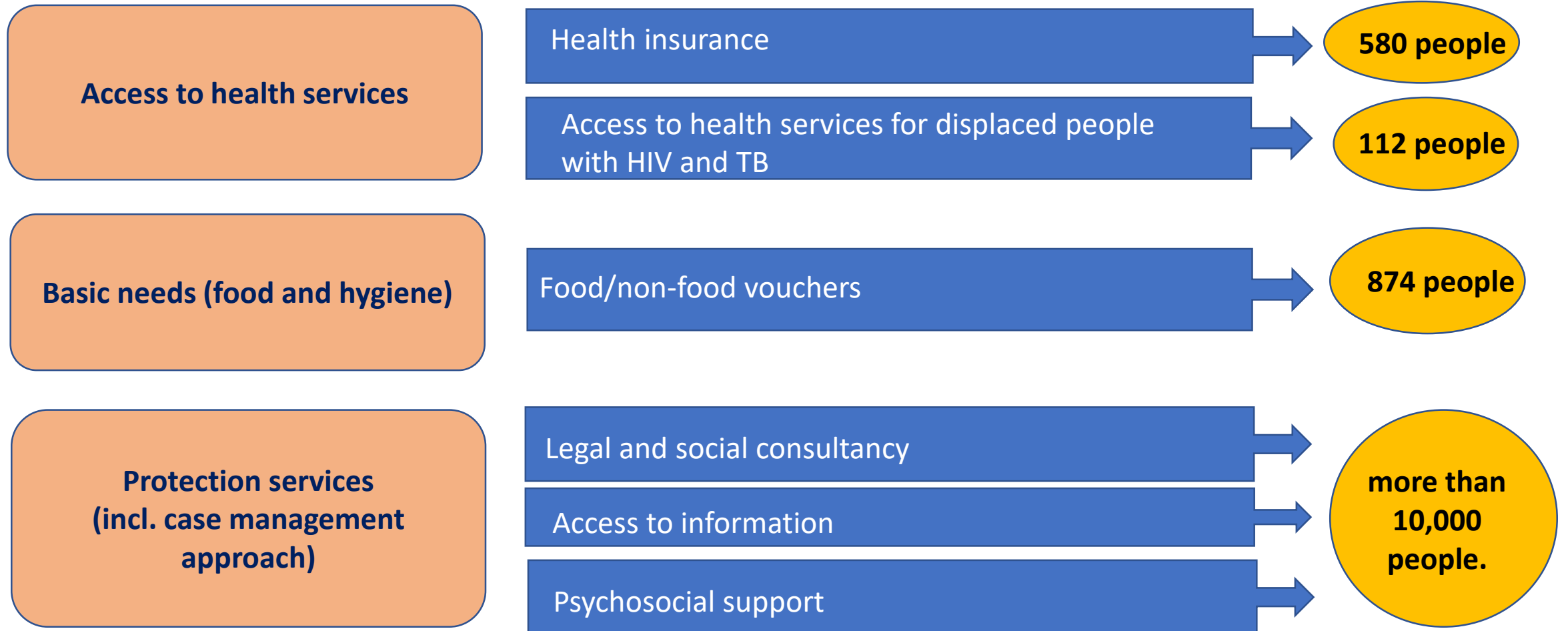
- The most vulnerable displaced people from South-East of Ukraine, and who do not have a certain status in Russia (elderly people, large families, PLHIV)

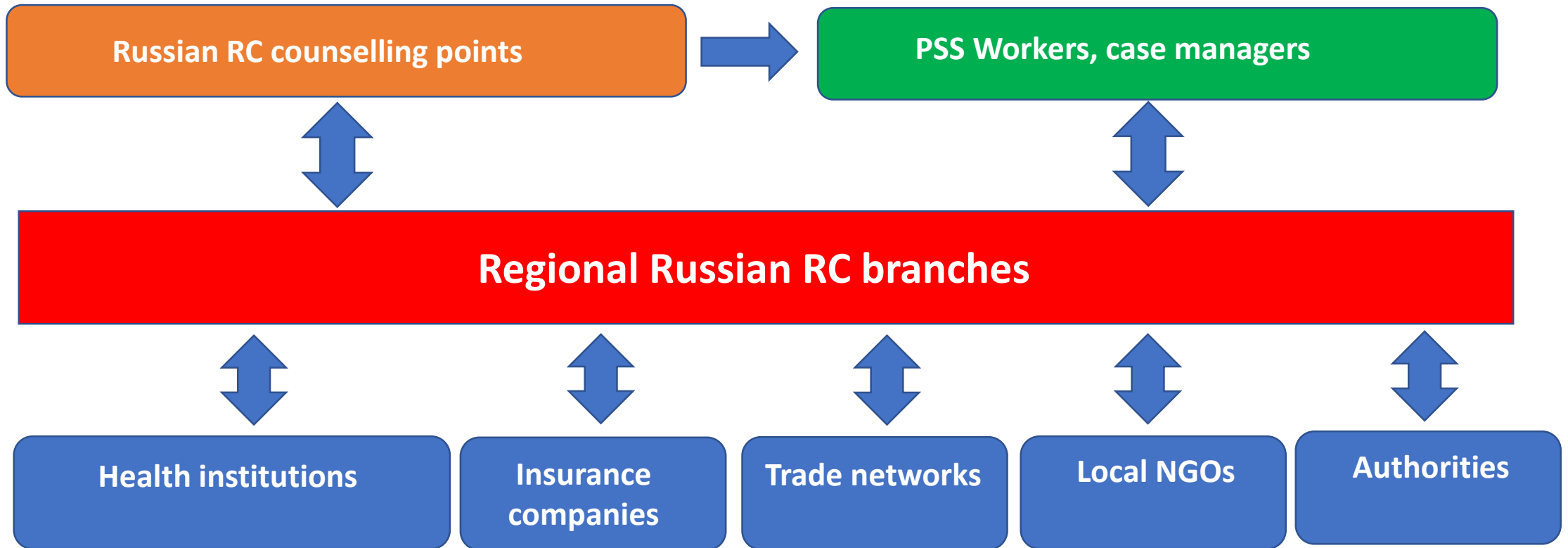

Organizational mechanism of humanitarian assistance

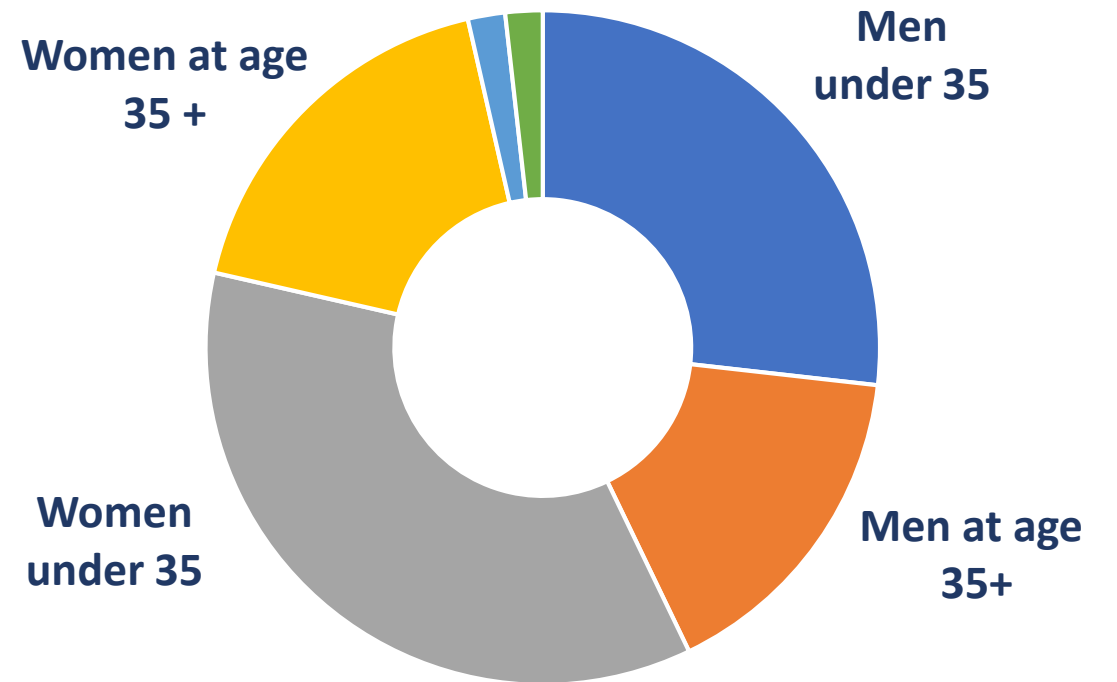
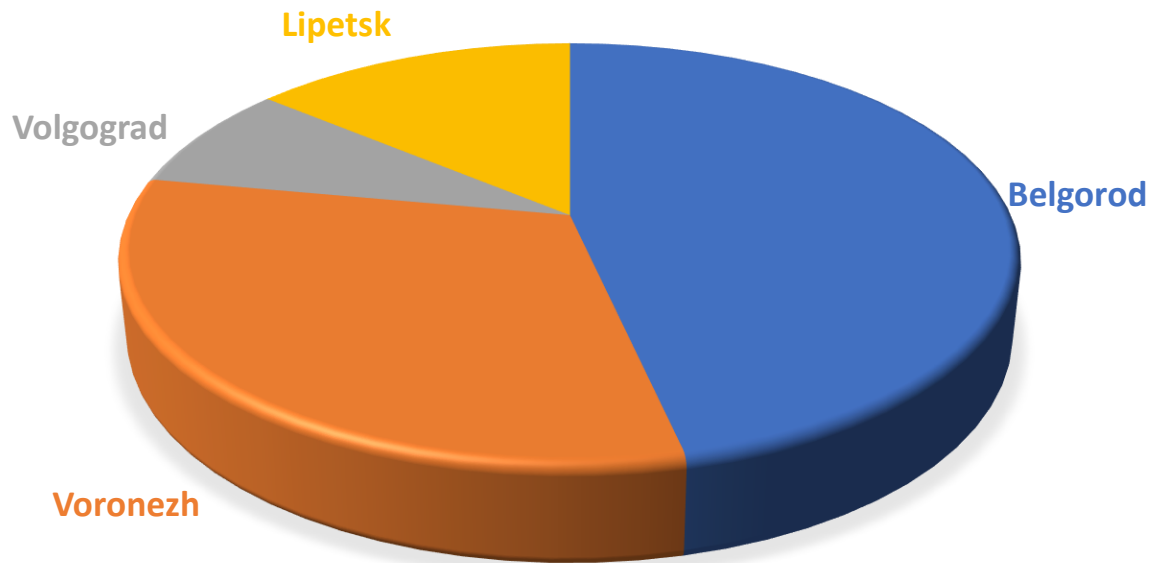

Comprehensive support to displaced people living with HIV

Access to treatment

- ARV therapy
- Treatment of concomitant diseases
- Additional diagnostics
- Prevention of vertical transmission of HIV.

Social support

- Vouchers for food-non food items

Consulting support

- Legal counselling, assistance in obtaining status
- Psychosocial support
