New Memorandum of Understanding signed between IFRC Europe and WHO Europe

A new MoU was signed between IFRC and WHO Europe on 7 September 2021. The MoU is covering the following areas of cooperation: Health Emergencies, Promotion of healthy lifestyles and NCDs prevention, Universal health coverage and Promotion of Health and Wellbeing, Voluntary Blood Donors Recruitment, evidencedbased approach, health data management and innovations. Both organizations reaffirmed their cooperation. High levelmeeting of both directors and series of thematic meetings was conducted.





World Aids Day 2021- End inequalities. End AIDS. End pandemics.

Every year, on 1 December, the world commemorates World AIDS Day. This World AIDS Day is highlighting the urgent need to end the inequalities that drive AIDS and other pandemics aroundthe world. IFRC Europe Healthand Care Team supported few NS to implement advocacyevents, devoted to the World AIDS Day 2021. Armenia RC, Kyrgyzstan Red Crescent, Russian and Tajikistan RC implemented different activities for raising awareness and increasing knowledge of HIV and the currentCOVID-19 pandemic, anti-stigma and antidiscrimination, highlighting of information on HIV and issues related the negative impact of COVID-19, to create positive attitude and friendly environment.

National Societies activities on HIV, AIDS, TB,Hepatitis and drug abuse

National Society - Armenia World AIDS Day



In the frame of the awareness raising campaign 4 types of activities were implemented:



1.Awareness raising campaign took place on the 1st of December 2021. The volunteers distributed more than 6000 flyers and red ribbons (made by volunteers) in the most crowded streets.
The ARCS cooperated with the CCM Armenia, which was providing free HIV tests on one of the main squares of Yerevan. The volunteers where also informing peopleabout it. 2. 30 volunteers were trained on the subject of HIV and interviewed HIV patients and discussed the stigma and discrimination the patients face. Afterwards the volunteers made posts on their Instagram pages on discrimination HIV patients face.



3. Three information sessions were conducted for refugees and asylum seekers by the ARCS expert with participation of 50 people.



4 Five information sessions were conducted for labour migrants in Gegharkunik and Shirak regions. 99 young people took part. Red ribbons and flyers were also provided during the information sessions.



National Society - Tajikistan World AIDS Day

Red CrescentSociety of Tajikistan has determined the direction in celebrating this date as providing supportfor the most vulnerable group-HIV positive children. Currently, only in the city of Dushanbe, more than 300 children with a diagnosis of "HIV infection" are registered. The Red Crescent Societyof Tajikistan, with the financial support of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, the USAID ETICA project and with the technical support of the partner organization TNWLHIV + «Tajikistan Network of Women Living with HIV», held a number of events dedicated to World AIDS Day under the slogan "End inequality, End AIDS". The start of the event was a campaign for children livingwith HIV in Dushanbe. 28 children who are registered on the city AIDS centerin Dushanbe were invited to this action.In order to prevent the dissemination of information on the status of children, the children of employees of the HQ and the capital city branch of the RCST in Dushanbe, a total numberof 12 children, were invited.

The invitedanimators of the Wallet Event Tajikistan campaignheld an entertaining New Year'sshow for children,with a number of competitions and festive performances. At the end of the action, each child was given a New Year's gift.



One of the next events was an exhibition of drawings by a representative of the targetgroup. This action is held for the third time and is aimed at supporting and developing the talent of the painter. Representatives of International and public HIV service organizations, Embassies and government agencies were invited to this exhibition.

As a result of the exhibition, 8 out of 13 presented paintings were purchasedby the representatives of the Embassies of the Republicof Belarus, the Republic of Turkey and representatives of ABTAssociated for a total of 400 US dollars.



National Society - Spain World TB Day

The World Health Assembly in 2014 approved the "End TB" strategy, which contemplates as global goals for 2035 the reduction of 95% of mortality, 90% of incidence and that there is no household that experience "catastrophic" costs from having contracted the disease.

The current contextplaces us beforea concerted scenarioof international commitment to put an end to the TB epidemic, so the updateof the Plan for the prevention and control of TB in Spain is timely. This Plan is unequivocally directed the prevention and controlof the transmission of pulmonary TB, as well as the detection and control of resistant forms, incorporating elements of territorial and intersectoral coordination with an explicit vocation of **"leaving no one behind".**

Because of that, Spanish Red Cross focuses on prevent and control the TB transmission from our Health Programme, from the Information and Prevent Service about IHV, Sexually Transmitted Infections and TB and different campaigns.

We attached the social media planification whichwas followed by the Information and Prevent Serviceabout IHV, SexuallyTransmitted Infections and TB becauseof last TB Day. To support this campaign, we have createdan specific space in our website dedicated to tuberculosis, where you can find short trainingvideos about: what is tuberculosis, its symptoms, types of tests, prevention, treatment, tuberculosis and HIV, and tuberculosis and COVID-19...



Italian Red Cross – Villa MarainiFoundation

The Villa Maraini Foundation is the National Agency for Addictions (alcohol, drug and gambling) of the ItalianRed Cross. Founded by Prof. Massimo Barra in 1976, it consists of aset of services based on different threshold levels:low, mediumand high, in order to differentiate the therapyaccording to the user's motivation. TheFoundation is open 24 hours a day 365 days per year, and provides treatment and rehabilitation of drug addiction, alcohol abuseand gambling basing its work on the 7 Fundamental Principlesof the Red Cross, first of all the principle of Humanity.



In September 2021 IFRC Europe Regional Health and Partnership development team: Davron Mukhamadiev, FranciscoFong and Eszter BAKONYVÁRI-KOÓS visitedVilla Maraini Center of Italian Red Cross. It was great to visit Villa Maraini Center, meet with colleagues, discuss our currentcooperation and furtherplans.

Training and ResearchActivities 2021

Villa Maraini Foundation has started a research with the University of Rome "LaSapienza" on the link betweenCovid-19 and drug addiction, starting from the observation that, apparently, the number of positive cases of COVID-19among Villa Maraini's clients was lower in comparison to the general population of Italy.

The study consist in the collection and analysis of blood samplings of 200 clients, involving not only patients under treatment, but also actived rug users who come to the Street Unit that provides needle exchange programme. Therefore, it will be a very varied and unique sample of people who use drugs.

As for 31th December 2021, a number of 150 blood samplings was already taken.







Training course on substance abuse treatment, harm reduction and humanitarian drug policy:

The training was held in Villa Maraini on 29 November - 3 December. It was attended by 11 representatives of RCRC NSs from Europe and Central Asia, and 7 representatives of other NGOs/networks workingon harm reduction.

Advocacy and International Activities:

IFRC "Health and care Conference" (1st March): during the session"Empowering communities for better health: perspectives from the field", a social worker of Villa Maraini participated as speaker, to talk about her own experience as former drug user now working with PWUDs, and to stress the importance of reaching hard-toreach groups and empower them through engagement.



International training of Pompidou Group – Council of Europe (20-21 October): the training was attended by law enforcement officers from different European countries. Massimo Barra and Mauro Patti made a presentation about the possible collaboration between lawenforcement agencies and drug abuse treatment services



World Drug Day :26 June: on the occasion of the UN World Drug Day, Villa Maraini organized the online debate "Humanitarian drug policy across 5 continents", to present the social campaign "Rome Consensus 2.0 & Support don't punish" attended by over 200 activists from all aroundthe world.



5th EuropeanHarm Reduction

Objective of the side event was to promote the principles and approaches of the Rome Consensus Manifesto, pushing for the application of evidence-based and public health-oriented measures. National Society- Georgia

GeorgiaRed Cross activities dedicated to the International Day of OverdoseAwareness Day

In frames of the International Day of OverdoseAwareness Day, August31, Georgia Red Cross Society joined the world's largest annual campaign to end overdose, raise awareness and remember without stigma those who have died and acknowledge the grief of the family and friends left behind. Time to Remember. Time to Act.

The Rome Consensus 2.0 was translated into Georgian and again disseminated among the key stakeholders, community-based organizations, organizations - members of the GeorgianHarm Reduction Network, key populations, and the general public to find more supporters, to gain their support, and to encourage them to sign THE ROME CONSENSUS 2.0 – TOWARDS HUMANITARIAN DRUG POLICY

GRCS together with other members of the Georgian Harm ReductionNetwork signed a petition requesting the Government for authorization of the over-the-counter sale of naloxone in pharmacies.

Besides, the partner organizations and the GRCS local branches were informed about availability and asked to share respective videos with hashtags:#HumanitarianDrugPolicy #IOAD2021 and #EndOverdose.
Starting from the first video with Dr. Massimo Barra, IFRC special envoy for health, founder of Fondazione Villa Maraini, the National Agency of the Italian Red Cross for pathological addictions, and creator of the Rome Consensus and with Ms. Giovanna Campello, Chief at UNODC Prevention, Treatment& Rehabilitation Section for supporting this initiative on International OverdoseAwareness Day 2021, several videos about OverdoseAwareness were shared through social media by the GRCS and partner organizations on a weekly basis.

On August 31'2021, the GRCS representatives attended a conference organized by the GeorgianHarm Reduction Network dedicated to highlighting the overdose mortality-related problems in Georgia and considering how to deal with overdose problems, and how to support approval of Naloxone selling in pharmacy stores.

Besides, from the beginning of August 2021, the GRCS was involved in active communication on the community level with target branches to spread the key messages across the whole country regarding the Rome Consensus 2.0 to raise the number of people realizing the importance of and supporting humanitarian approach towards people using drugs. Informational online training was held in all 39 target branches on the harm of drug abuse and the importance of harm reduction and practical sessions on first aid in case of overdose for approximately 390 leader volunteers to spread correct information further among their peers.

On August 31 the key messages highlighting the overdose problem and the importance to end overdose were disseminated through the GRCS social media channels.

World TB Day National Society – Uzbekistan





These events are actively covered in local media, social networks and in special created groups,in mobile applications (mainly Telegram).

One of the main directions of the statutory activities of the Red CrescentSociety of Uzbekistan is the promotion of a healthy lifestyle among the population, the conduct of sanitary and educational work to prevent the spread of infectious diseases and prevent the incidence of socially significant diseases, and others. In this connection, the Red CrescentSociety of Uzbekistan, its subordinate organizations and local branches(in the centers of regions, in rural areas and remote settlements) carry out the above activities on an ongoing basis, as well as on such dates as:





June 26 - International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking

December 1 - World AIDS Day, for the population - in crowded places, for pupils and students - in generaleducational institutions - schools and higher educational institutions, special actions, educational classes, seminars and roundtables are organized.

NATIONAL SOCIETY – AZERBAIJAN WORLD TB DAY











The Red Crescent Society of Azerbaijan continue sits activities in the field of COVID-19and tuberculosis. The Azerbaijan Red Crescent Society (ARCS), being a member of the TB Coalition of Azerbaijan NGOs (since 2011) within the framework of the Regional TB Program for Eastern Europe and Central Asia (TB REP 2.0), carries out wide activities in the field of tuberculosis in the country. This activity includes conducting webinars, educational seminars, as well as participating in screening for the detection of COVID-19 and tuberculosis.

The COVID-19pandemic has once again highlighted the importance of digital technology, medical equipment and the use of portable medical examinations that enable home screening.

Decentralization of surveys can reduce the number of viral infections.

In order to detect tuberculosis in our country, inform the population about COVID-19 and tuberculosis, a number of organizations have taken measures to improve the epidemiological situation using digital technologies. During 2021, ARCS, as part of the activities of the TB Coalition, participated in screening in various cities and regions of Azerbaijan. Screening was performed using Japanese-made Fujifilm FDR X-Air portable X-ray equipment using digital artificial intelligence.

The advantage of the device is that it weighs only 6 kg and emits less

ultraviolet radiation, which results in better quality and more accurate images. For 9 months of 2021, 125 patients with tuberculosis were diagnosed, of which 42 (34%) - as a result of mass screening.

March 24, dedicated to World TB Day, a online conference on the topic "Tuberculosis in children and COVID-19" was held with the participation of foreign experts. The online conference was organized within the framework of cooperation of the ARCS with the Center for Public Health and Reforms of the Ministry of Health of the Republic of Azerbaijan, the Azerbaijan State Advanced Training Institute of Doctors named after A. A. Aliyev, "Saglamliga xidmet" Public Union and with the support of the TB REP Program. The goal of this online conference was to exchange experience with Turkish and Latvian experts and familiarize with international experience in general. 147 people took part in the online conference.

Also on March 24, several famous buildings of the city, including the historical and architectural monument of the 12th century "Maiden Tower" and "Baku Olympic Stadium", were painted red in order to draw attention to the fight against tuberculosis. Thus, this year Azerbaijan joined this initiative, which has been carried out all over the world since 2017.

National Society – Latvia World AIDS Day

Within the World AIDS Day campaign, from 23 November till 5 December 2021 different activities were organized all over Latvia.

In addition, Latvian Red Cross organized activities to raise awareness, invited people to make HIV express tests in order to find out what is their HIV status, and also participated in several educational and public events organized by LatRC partners, Stateinstitutions and Non-governmental organizations (NGOs).

All health rooms were provided with an anonymous HIV rapid test. An online lecture "Human habits and their impact on health" and a discussion with other NGOs "Together against HIV - what can we do better?" The youth volunteers produced videos about HIV testing, which were posted on all social networks. The youth volunteers informed the public about the problems of HIV and AIDS, distributed information materials and condoms to the population.

Celebrating World AIDS Day 1th of December

Every year in the period from 1 th -7th of December, the Red Cross of the Republic of North Macedonia in honor of the celebration of World AIDS Day, marks HIV / AIDS prevention week. With this activity, the National Society aims to raise public awareness of the importance of prevention and early diagnosis of this disease with special emphasis on the young population. The HQ of the Red Cross of North Macedonia in accordance with the recommendations of the World Health Organization, the International Federation of Red Cross and other relevant sources prepares guidelines for Red Cross branches in order to implement activities for educating the population for proper and timelyHIV/ AIDS prevention



This year, the Red Cross of the Republic of North Macedonia, in accordance with the calendar of traditional activities in the period from 1-7 December 2021, marked the Week on Fight against HIV / AIDS under the motto "Education is the best prevention of HIV infection." During the Week, the Red Cross of the Republic of North Macedonia shared directions to 32 Red Cross Branches to organize peer to peer educational workshops in high schools, film short educational videos with messages on HIV / AIDS prevention and to share posts, flyers on messages for prevention of HIV / AIDS. All these activities were aimed to raise awareness among the young population about the importance of timely prevention of HIV / AIDS.

UKRAINE WORLD AIDS DAY



Ukrainian Red Cross activities on HIV,TB,Hepatitis URCS provided anti-TB activities during 2020. URCS has been constantly implementing TB awareness campaign, and since 2019, the training module on the infectious disease risks such as TB, HIV, hepatitis has been included into the first-aid training program.

TB is one of the main topic in CBHFA activities (information sessions and consultations for population). To the World TB Day Ukrainian RC developed and printed some informational materials. Adding printing TB materials into the food and PSS parcels (which were distributed during quarantine) let to provide more complex approach in URCS humanitarian aid. As well URC distributed printing materials among FA trainings participants.

World TB Day – Kyrgyzstan RC

Every year on March 24, the Red Crescent of Kyrgyzstan celebrates World TB Day, which aims to raise awareness of the devastating health and social impact of TB, and inform about the economic impact of TB, and thus intensify efforts to combat the global epidemic. this disease. On this day, large-scale events dedicated to this day were held throughout the country. Colorful processions took place in Issyk-Kul, Talas and Batken regions. Food packages for patients with tuberculosis were also distributed in the regions. Competitions were held among students of secondary schools in regional centers. A roundtable dedicated to the WorldTuberculosis Day was held in some regions of the country.



Organization of a puppet theater in kindergartens on the topic "Hygiene and hygiene of cough" in 24 kindergartens of the country.A competition of drawings and video clips on the topic: Stigma towards TB patients was held among secondary and high school students of regional schools. A photo competition was held on the topic:"Stigma discrimination againstTB patients and how to deal with it" among students of universities and vocational schools. The report "Positive history of TB patient" was broadcast on the air of media centers in Jalal-Abad region. An information campaign was carried out among the population (distribution of brochures, booklets, posters). Lectures on the topic "Stigma towards TB patients" in the different schools, universities. Organization of a quest game for volunteers of the RCSC KR with questions on the topic "Tuberculosis". Flash mob with the participation of healthcare workers, law enforcement agencies, LSG in the Talas market, as well as a quiz (question-answer) on the topic "What do I know about tuberculosis".



World AIDS Day - Kyrgyzstan RC



Every year on December 1st, people from all over the world come together to show support for people living with HIV. Campaigns were held throughout the country to raise awareness and inform citizens about HIV/AIDS. The main goal of the events is to remind people of the seriousness of the situation and tell as much as possible about the disease, ways of its transmission, timely diagnosis and effective preventive measures. Together we will defeat AIDS.



Health is one of the main factors of human well-being. Reminding about caring for their own health, the WAID 2021 campaign calls on the population of Kyrgyzstan to get tested for HIV, people living with HIV about adherence to therapy, and communities about existing prevention measures. Kyrgyzstan RC through installation of 11 light boards in Bishkek at public stops, reached more than 400 000 people learned about HIV prevention and treatment. Kyrgyzstan RC provided humanitarian aid (food kits) to children living with HIV in Osh oblast and families of PLHIV in Chui oblast.The food kits were distributed as planned to 14 most needy PLHIV families in Chui oblast and

families of 14 children living with HIV in Osh city.



At the request of the AIDS Center, we participated in field campaigns to receive free tests in the markets, streets, and livestock markets. An action aimed at early diagnosis of HIV, Red Crescent staff helped to attract people for testing. The action was held jointly with the medical workers of the AIDS Center.

Good Habits Fair - volunteers and students prepared numbers to promote a healthy lifestyle. The event at the Asia Mall in Bishkek was held:

-Holding an information session on AIDS/HIV; -Kahood game with mall visitors; -Flash mob "Hug me".



Actions were carried out jointly with the AIDS center "This is your health! It's your right!It's your responsibility" Distribution of brochures, booklets, posters among the population in crowded places. The sports event was held in the Nooken region dedicated to World AIDS Day. Conducted information and educational work on the prevention of HIV infection.

A Round Table was held together with partners in all regions of the country.

National Society – Russian Federation World TB Day

Every year, the Irkutsk regionaL and LocaL branches of the Russian Red Cross hoLd preventive measures on this day.

Volunteers of the Irkutsk regional branch of the All-Russian public organization "Russian Red Cross" held an action dedicated to World TB Day, as well as educational lectures for students and teachers of the Irkutsk College of Architecture and Construction.

The Nukut local branch of the Russian Red Cross in the village of Novonukutsky held an action to distribute leaflets with information on how to protect yourself and your loved ones from tuberculosis.

Ainura Abdulsanovna Amirmetova and district pediatric TB doctor Nikiforova Yulia Aleksandrovna spoke about the danger of tuberculosis and the prevention of the disease.Experts also answered frequently asked questions: who can get infected, what are the signs of the disease, the main methods of diagnosis and treatment.

Promotions "White Flower of Life"

As part of the Stop TB Together project, implemented using a grant from the President of the Russian Federation provided by the Presidential Grants Fund, the Khakassian Republican Branch of the All-Russian PublicOrganization "Russian Red Cross" in the period from 23.03.2021 - 03/24/2021 held the campaign "White Flower of Life" dedicated to the World TB Day in the cities of Abakan, Abaza and Chernogorsk.

During the actions, more than 450 residents of the Republic of Khakassia received reliable information about tuberculosis (paths of infection, symptoms of tuberculosis); information leaflets, which, in addition to information about tuberculosis, indicate the address where you can contact for diagnostics, treatment and prevention.







Employees and 25 volunteers of the project took part in the action. The Khakass Republican Branch of the All-Russian PublicOrganization "Russian Red Cross" thanks the students and teachers of the State Budgetary Educational Institution of the Republic of Arts "Chernogorsk Miningand Construction College", the State Budgetary Educational Institution of the Republic of Arts "Khakass Polytechnic College" and the branch of the State Budgetary Educational Institution of the Republic of Arts "Chernogorsk Mining and Construction College" for their active participation in the action.

On March 24, the Samara Regional Branch of the All-Russian Public Organization "Russian Red Cross" together with the Samara Regional Clinical Tuberculosis Dispensary. N.V. Postnikov and Samara City Clinical Hospital No. ON THE.Semashko held a preventive action "White Chamomile". Also, medical workers of the VolgaCentral District Hospital took part in the action.

The action dedicated to the World TB Day was attended by students of the SamaraMedical College. N. Lyapina and the Samara State College of Service Technologies and Design, who distributed more than 1000 booklets among the residents of Samara on the topic: "Tuberculosis is dangerous and very contagious, but curable." OnMarch 26, 2021, as part of the antituberculosis activities, the Kamchatka RegionalBranch of the Russian Red Cross held an action at the Kamchatka Regional TB Dispensary.

Employees of the Kamchatkaregional branch of the RKK installed an information bazooka in the reception hall of the TB dispensary, allocated booklets about tuberculosis for distribution to incoming people.In order to prevent the fight against tuberculosis, the KamchatkaRegional Branch of the RussianRed Cross allocated





WORLD AIDS DAY - Russian RC

On April 2, Executive Director of the Russian Red Cross, Pavel Savchuk, visited the Tula regional branch, where he met with its chairman,Galina Golovanova. At the meeting, the development of the basic directions of the RKK, the work of the Tula regional branch and further prospects were discussed.

During the meeting, the results of project activities were summed up. For 10 years, the Tula regional branch of the RKK has been implementing the project "Care and support for people living with HIV". During this time, 191 patients with HIV infection received help, 58 of them returned to active life, 43 people began to work, 10 people received help at home. Also, within the framework of the project, a charity event is regularly held to provide material assistance to HIV-infected people

Reckitt (Durex brand) and the RussianRed Cross have agreed to cooperate and are launching a social campaign dedicated to the AIDS Day. Its goal is to encourage as many people as possible to be attentive to intimate health and minimize the risk of contracting HIV, use condoms and get tested regularly.

World AIDS Day is celebrated on December 1st. Its goal is to draw attention to the spread of HIV infection and raise awareness about it. Every year it is held under different slogans that reflect the most pressing issues. This year, the World Health Organization (WHO) is focusing on the availability of information, testing and treatment for HIV. The theme for WorldAIDS Day is "End Inequality. Eliminate AIDS"[i].

The large-scale social mission of the Durex brand and the RussianRed Cross in support of the fight against the

spread of HIV in the RussianFederation will include awareness-raising campaigns and educational initiatives. The beginning of cooperation was marked by a joint action - Durex will transfer part of the funds received from the sale of condoms from November 1 to December 12, 2021, to the Russian Red Cross to support HIV prevention



Europe Regional Webinar Addressing to specific needsof people livingwith HIV, Tuberculosis, Hepatitis and drug users in COVID-19 context



On the 21st of January ERNA together with IFRC RegionalOffice for Europe organized the webinar entitled "Addressing to specific needs of people living with HIV, Tuberculosis, Hepatitis and drug users in COVID-19 context".

The event featured presentations by Dr. Askar YEDILBAYEV - WHO Europe Regionaloffice, Dr. DavronMukhamadiev – IFRC Europe Health and Care Coordinator; good practices shared by the NSs from across the region including Tajik, Kyrgyz, Spanish,Croatian, Slovenian Italian and Azerbaijan National Societies. The event seeked to share knowledge in assisting key vulnerable populations during the pandemic, covering psycho-social support, harm reduction, and tools to support people in line with COVID-19 response framework. ERNA Online Meeting related to Covid-19 pandemic and its consequences on local healthservices addressed to TB, HCV, HIV, and Drug User patients on the 5th November 2021

The European Red Cross and Red CrescentNetwork on HIV, AIDS and TB (ERNA),with the support and cooperation of the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC) and the Ukrainian Red Cross, organized an ERNA online meeting on 5 November 2021 on the COVID-19 pandemic and its consequences for local health services providers on TB, HIV, and beneficiaries including drug users.

More than 70 participants from the Red Cross and Red CrescentSocieties of Uzbekistan, Russia, Slovakia, Latvia, Northern Macedonia, Spain, Turkey, Georgia, North Macedonia, Bulgaria, Kyrgyzstan, Ukraine, Italy participated in the meeting as well as the guest speakers from WHO. They discussed the impact of COVID-19 to vulnerable community and shared their experiences in the fight against TB, HIV, HCV.
